The hostess served a delicious repast. There was a guessing game.

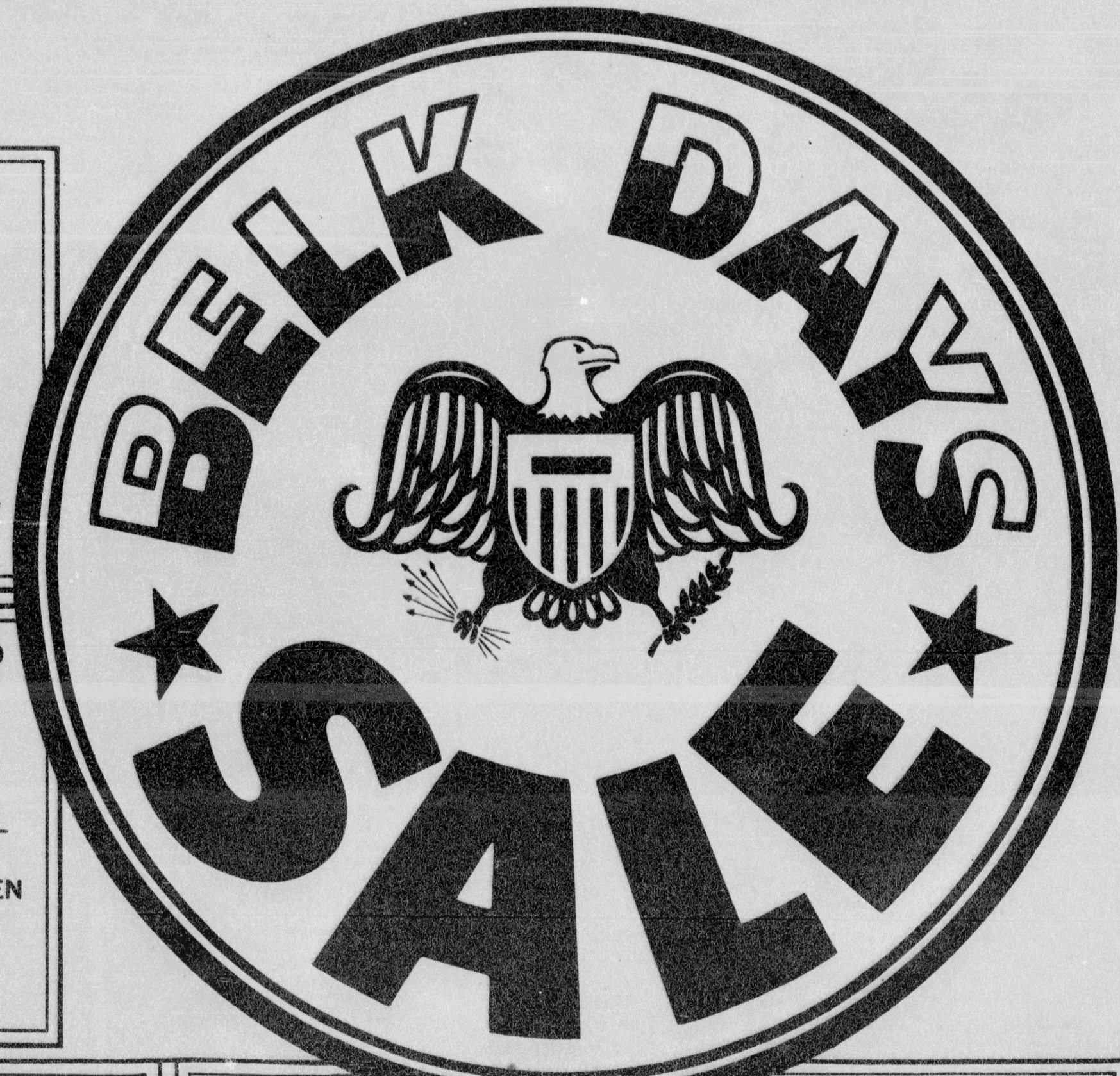
