NCSA TO PRESENT "THE LITTLE FOXES"

Lillian Hellman's "The Little Foxes," directed by Dr. William Jaeger, is the North Carolina School of the Arts' 1971 entry in the American College Theatre Festival. It will be presented by the schools of Drama and Design and Production at the NCSA Theatre from November 5-8 and 10-13 at 8:15.

The Arts School is one of more than 250 colleges participating in the Festival which is presented by the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and the Smithsonian Institution. Ten productions will be Normal, Ill., and the lighting by Robert J. Tompkins, lighting design major from White Plains, N. Y. The director, Dr. Williams Jaeger, has appeared in about 50 television shows and 15 Broadway and off-Broadway productions, including "Highway Robbery," "Delirium of the Sorrows" and "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof." He holds a B. A. and M. A. in speech from Brooklyn College and a doctorate from New York University.

Before coming to the school of the Arts, he was a member of the faculty of the University of Delaware, where he directed "Rashomon" and appeared as Galileo in the play of B. Shaw's and Bumbridge in Saul Bellow's "The Last Analysis." He is also taught at the Drama Lab and the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York and at Brooklyn College.

Admission is charged for "The Little Foxes" and reservations may be arranged by calling the School's box office calling 1:00 and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday at 784-7966.

Open for presentation in Washington in April, 1972. "The Little Foxes" is an intense play that depicts the spirit of acquisitiveness in a southern family who have come to financial prominence in the Post-Civil War period. The Hubbards: Ben, Oscar, Regina and Leo are crass materialists with little regard and less feeling for romanticists like Oscar's wife, Birdie, who is descended from the landed aristocracy of the ante-bellum south.

The action of the play revolves around the efforts of the Hubbards to conclude a deal with William Marshall of Chicago to build a cotton mill in Alabama, where they live. They need an additional \$75,000 from Regina's husband who is recuperating from a heart condition in Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore. The greed of the family drives them in various ways to deception, theft, alcohol, murder and in the final redemptive moment of the play, to courage.

Margot Rose, Griffith, Ind., will appear in the leading role of Regina with Arthur Ernberger, Charlotte, as her conniving brother Ben. Others in the cast are Margaret Bynum, Lucama, Karen Young, Adelphi, Md.; John Coggeshall, Uncasville, Conn.; Stephen Geiger, Millington, N. J.; Kathleen Masterson, Alexandria, Va.; Stephen Evans, Glen Burnie, Md.; Bernard Turner and Jon Thompson, both from Charlotte. The turn of the century set
