**Nov. 11-12
Are Curtis-Davis Days**

ST. LOUIS, Mo. - ACTION, a St. Louis based human rights organization, calls for a two-day boycott of all school classes, Thursday, Nov. 11 and Friday, Nov. 12 to support the campaign of twelve demands made upon the St. Louis Board of Education, including the re-naming of area high schools. ACTION seeks to have Northwest changed to Angela Davis High School; Soldan to Robert Curtis High; Beaumont to Malcolm X High; and Central to Dr. Martin Luther King High. It is said approximately twenty-five thousand leaflets entitled "2 Days Off -- Robert Curtis - Angela Davis Days" and having pictures of Attorney Robert Curtis, a former controversial St. Louis Legal Aid lawyer, now with a Legal Aid Project in Newark, New Jersey, and Angela Davis, have been circulated.

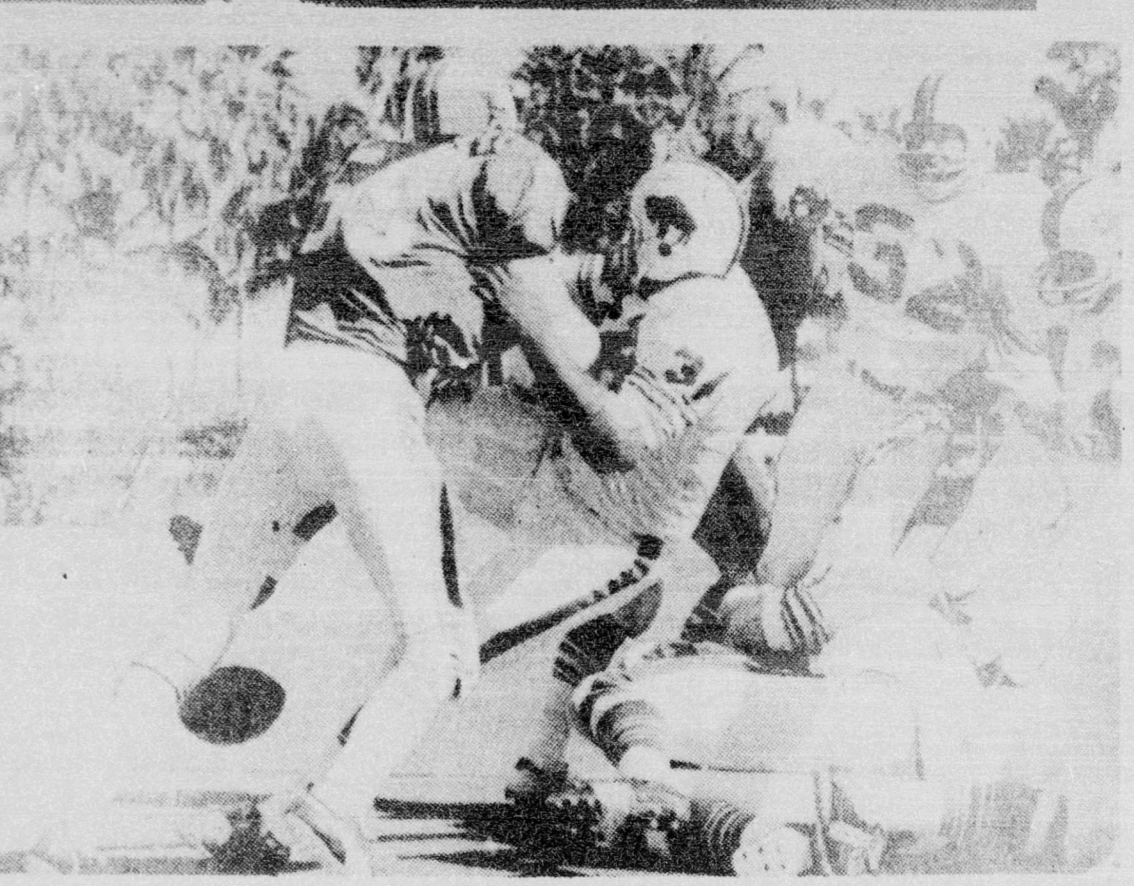
Elementary, high school, and university students, in the city and county, both Black and white, are being asked to honor the Curtis-Davis Days by not attending classes. Additional support is also being solicited of parents, teachers, and the public at large, to take this day off from work-cold in stock, etc. "It would be a golden opportunity," said ACTION's Chairman Percy Green, "to take these two days and read about the many good things concerning these two Black courageous persons. After gaining this knowledge, self style, inform your youngsters. Remember, you cannot depend on the Board of Education to inform you or your youngster the truth about anything; they're too busy lying and making excuses for everything being requested of them."

ACTION's first school boycott was October 1, termed Angela Davis Day. Some weeks ago, ACTION re-issued twelve demands to be met by the public school system. The Board, so far, has ignored the demands, as was expected by ACTION officials. ACTION said that it has a commitment to "wipe-out" the Board's "I don't give a damn" attitude toward meaningful education by Black definition.

ACTION SETS NEW BREAD BOYCOTT GUIDELINES
In a new communique to area merchants concerning the Wonder Bread - Hostess Cake boycott, ACTION instructs the boycottants to refrain from stocking the product until June 1972. ACTION says, however, if sufficient progress is made regarding the hiring and upgrading of blacks before that date, the merchants will be contacted directly by an ACTION official. If no progress is made, the boycott will be extended six more months.

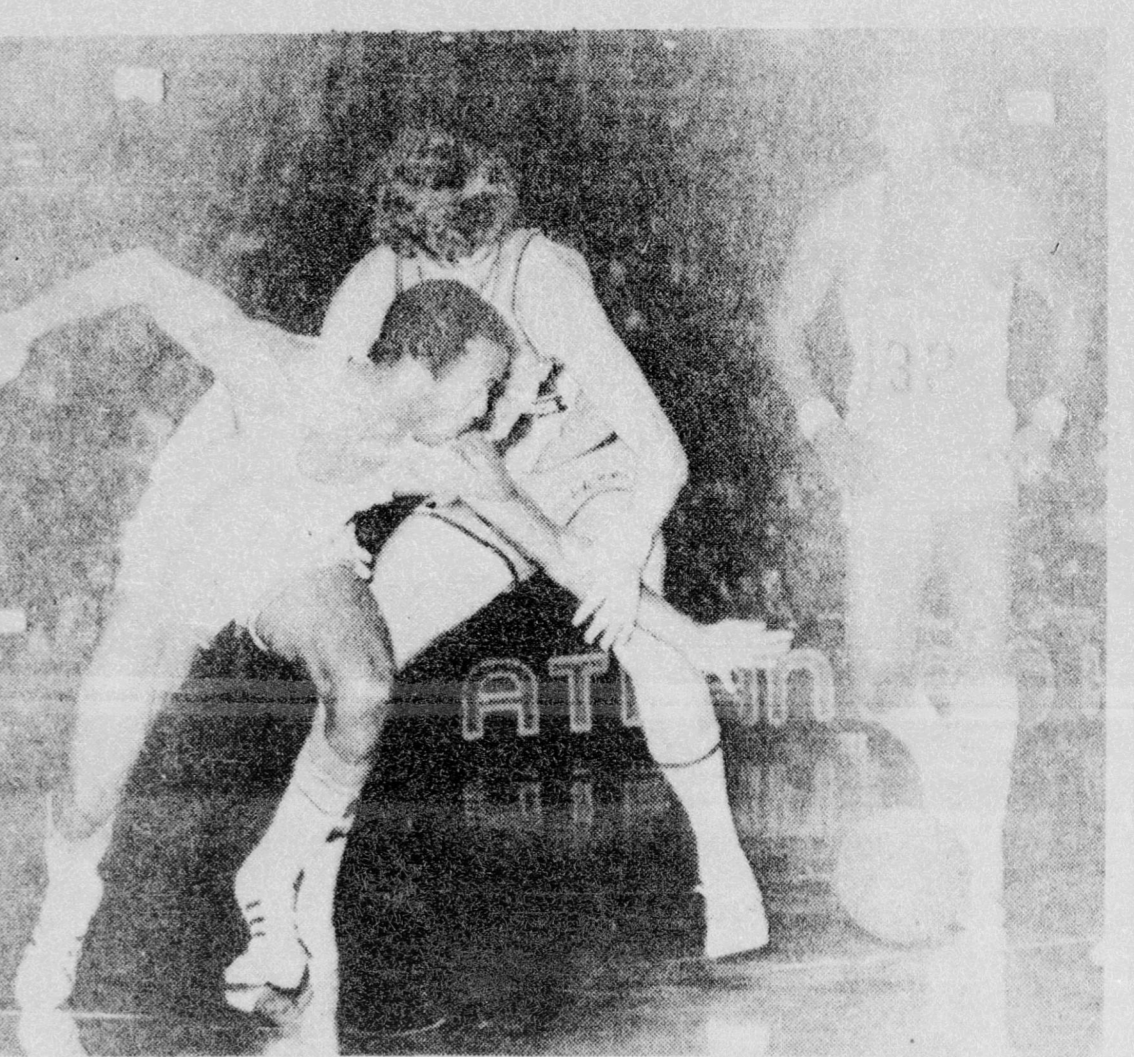
DOLLS TEACH GROOMING
There are better ways than lecturing and scolding to foster good grooming in young daughters.
Certainly, before they're old enough to care for themselves, our example and the attention we mothers give their hair, for instance, helps set a pattern for the future.
But, once a girl gets to be four or five years old, she wants to start making her own decisions about how she looks.
