Tax Deductions Are Allowed For Some Personal Losses, IRS Says

Greensboro -- Damage to a car, home, or other nonbusiness property may qualify as a deduction on Federal income tax returns, J. E. Wall, District Director of Internal Revenue for North Carolina said.

Tax deductions may usually be taken when the damage to non-business property occurs from a natural disaster such as a fire, flood, storm or hurricane. Losses from theft may also be deducted. However, losses resulting from such causes as rust, erosion, termites, etc. are not deduct-

Wall said the distinction between a deductible and a non-deductible casualty rests on whether the event causing the disaster was sudden or unexpected. Damage to a home from a fire or flood is deductible because the event was sudden or unexpected whereas damage from termites or settling due to erosion is not deductible since it occurs over a long period of time.

Mr. Wall said that on real property held for personal use, the amount of the loss is either the adjusted basis of the property or the decrease in its fair market value - whichever
