 The Gospel Jubilee Singers, Ed Hall and the Evening Five, the Holloway Sisters and others will be on a program at the Jesus House of Deliverance.

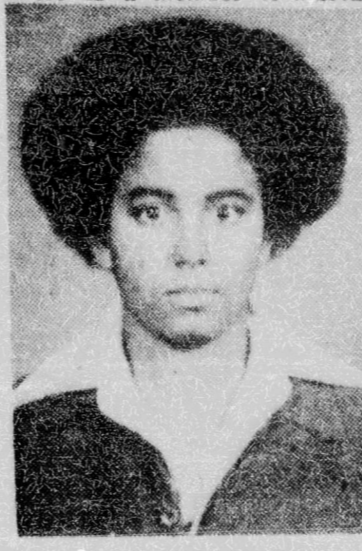


The program will be on Feb. 20 at 5 p.m. Mother Mary Frazier is the pastor.

Artist Of The Week

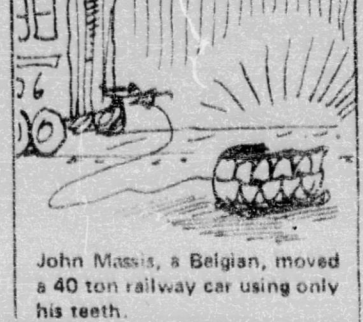
