Wilson Bruce Inborden, a retired St. Augustine's College and Washington High School mathematics and physics instructor, was funeralized here Wednesday morning at the Haywood Funeral Chapel with Father Arthur J. Calloway, presiding. Interment was in the Carolina Biblical Gardens.

Inborden, who died Sunday night at Wake Memorial Hospital after a brief illness, was born in Brock, N.C., to the late Thomas S. Inborden and Sarah Evans Inborden. He graduated from Howard University with a B.S. degree in civil engineering. He did further study at Columbia University and Catholic University of Washington.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Nan Bradford Inborden, a sister, Mrs. Dorothy Inborden Miller, two nephews and a nephew-in-law, all of Washington, D.C.

**CINCINNATI** - Ohio's major national campaign to gain mass support for private black higher education was kicked off last Sunday in Cincinnati with a ringing challenge by a top black leader.

Education must become the number one priority of the black community in the 1970s because it is the key to survival and the road to liberation, Arthur A. Fletcher, Executive Director of the United Negro College Fund, said.
