Officials Seek Conspirators In Louisiana Police Slayings

National Black News Service WASHINGTON — The reac-tion of public officials to the killings of three police men in New Orleans last week, al-legedly by Black gunmen, was to call for death penalty legislation for persons convict-ed of killing policemen while performing their duty. The other predictable reac-tion was to pronounce that there exists a "conspiracy" of "terrorists" who are bent on "setting race against race" U.S. Rep. Richard H. Ichord, D. Mo., said he would seek immediate hearings by the House Judiciary Committee on a bill he had previoulsy introducted making it a Federal crime to kill or assault a law

crime to kill or assult a law officer or fireman while in the line of duty. Sen. James Eastland, D. Miss., said he would introduce legislation to restore the death

penalty for killing policemen. Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Eastland said his bill would also make the killing of a policeman a Federal crime and a similar bill is being prepared by Sen. Richard S. Schweiker, R. Pa. Louisiana's Ed Edwards, in remarkable contrast to bis lack

Louisiana's Ed Edwards, in remarkable contrast to his lack of public outrage at the law-officer slayings of two Black Southern University students, delcared that "at-tacks on the policemen and fireman constitute attacks on the whole society." Louisiana's Attorney General William Guste has call for a Federal investigation to det-ermine whether the Howard Johnson killings were part of a

Johnson killings were part of a "national suicidal group" bent on spreading racial warfare across the country. Guste reported that U. S. Attorney General Richard

national group. "Their purpose is to cause the people to be dissatisfied, to bring race against race, black against white, young against old, to cause international chaos," Guste said of the alleged comparised

Meanwhile, some observers of political trends in the United States predict that local black communities all over the country will feel the effects of the official campaign to "un-cover" the "terrorists" and "conspitators" that law officers will be attempting to find.
