Art To Be Used For Props

LOS ANGELES - Instead of the normal props and scenery used in a television series "Black Omnibus" is using exhibitions of visual art forms by black artists.

"Black Omnibus" is a weekly television series seen on WRD-TV each Sunday at 5:30. Each program in the series explores black involvement in such multi-faceted activities as music, comedy, the arts, dance, religion, and other subjects.

The selection of the art forms to be used is made primarily by Claude Booker, assistant art director for "Black Omnibus" Museums, galleries, and other forms of exposure have generally been closed to black artists, and it was decided that the TV series offered a unique opportunity to give some of these artists exposure they deserve.

One of the artists to be given recognition is the late Carl Gray whose promising career ended at 26 in a motorcycle accident. Gray first surfaced in Watts after the riots when attention was focused on the area and its promising artists.

Gray won several awards, scholarships and grants. One of which gave him the opportunity to study in Chicago with the celebrated Richard Hunt, considered one of the leading black sculptors in America.

Claude Booker, the assistant art director and curator of art for "Black Omnibus" is an instructor of art history at Otis Art Institute and California State College at Dominguez Hills.

"Black Omnibus" is a Quins Production presented in association with CPM Programs, Inc., and is the first major black-oriented series designed for nationwide commercial television.

James Earl Jones, the distinguished star of stage, motion pictures and television serves as host of "Black Omnibus."

Hal Graham is executive producer of the program series.

E Bond sales for the year were \$85,603,090. Sales of Series H were \$1,518,000. The combined percentage increase in sales over 1971 was 15.3 percent.
