Calls For A 10 Percent Cut In Nation's Taxes

WASHINGTON — Dr. Andrew F. Brimmer, the only black to have served as a member of the Federal Reserve Board, has called for a 10 percent cut in the taxes Americans will owe next April in order to atimulate the lagging sconomy.

In letters to President Ford and congressional leaders. Brimmer the one-shot cutback in federal income taxes is needed to put more purchasing power into the hands of consumers at a time when production is lagging and unemployment is rising.

Taxpayers would have extra money to spend either through smaller final tax payments or through larger refunds of money withheld on theri 1974 income.

"I think most of it would be spent." Brimmer said. "and this spending is needed to restore production." Total individual income tax liabilities are estimated at \$132 billion to spend, in addition to spend, in addition to the \$18 billion expected to be refunded to taxpayers under existing law.
