

As the Christmas Season nears, murders have begun to run rampant in the Raleigh and Wake County communities. Two men have been killed and as many other men have been "hauled off" to Wake County Jail to await hearings.

hearings. Police have charged a Raleigh man with the slaying a Zebukon readert in south tarcigh last Friday. George Grace Munson, 27, of Zebulon, was found dead outside a house at 413 S. Bloodworth St., about 9 p.m. Friday. Munson had been shot with a small calibre handgun in the side and in the leg. Munson died 4 hours later at Wake Medical Center, and during the weekend, police apprehended Charlie Junior Haris, 48, of 711 E. Hargett St., and charged him with the murder. 



Shaw University and 8 other predominantl) black colleges and universities have received a grant totalling 3731,000 from the U.S. Justice Department's Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, to develop professional training for crim-nal justice careers for blacks and other minorities. Shaw University has receiv-ed 864,000 matched with \$31,000 of its own monies to total \$85,000 for the 16-month pilot program

\$95,000 for the 18-month pilot program Crininial Justice tracks or courses are being developed within the Department of Public Administration. Research conducted by the Justice Department showed that major colleges and universities failed to interest black and other minorities in critical justice careers and small institutions generally have not offered the training.

The area of Criminal Justice has turned off blacks and minorities because they have traditionally been geared to ward white concepts and values. Shaws program will seek to train persons in criminal justice areas to be broad thinkers. In other words, Shaw hopes to make the training relevant

Shaw's program will focus on several areas of criminal justice including law enforce-ment, corrections and juvenile delinquency.
