(3) Carreer Choice: Opportuni-

(3) Career Choice: Opportunities are now opened, that are unlimited for black women. They need your support. (4) Health Problems: Infections and Accidents. They need Primary Health Care, and

Counseling, and Confidentiality without fear of retribution.
Health problems are: Obesity, Allergy, Menstrual, Diabetes, Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking, VD, Cavities, Emotional Disorders, Contractives. The Goal is Prevention. (5) Sexual Activity: Consequences are pregnancies, abortions. VD and high and Minnie Adams.
