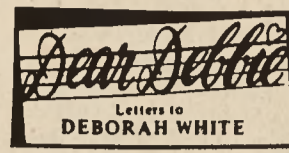

Pointers On How A Person Gets Nutrition From Cold Food

How does a person get good nutrition when: • It is a cool -20 degrees outside and a cool 15 degrees in the kitchen; • The altitude is so high that water boils at just 110 degrees, if it doesn't evaporate first; • An individual needs at least 5,000 calories a day merely to replace the calories burned from physical exertion; • And the routine is followed daily for three months.

It may not be the way to enjoy nouvelle cuisine, but for 16 mountaineers on their way to the summit of Mt. Everest, it works. They are part of the 1984 Ultima Thule Everest expedition. And though mountaineering is not new to them, Everest, they admit, is a challenge. "Surviving three months in the bitter cold under extreme physical conditions does require a certain willingness to endure," conceded Warren C. Thompson, a Seattle tax consultant and the expedition's team leader. "Before an expedition I try to gain weight, because I know that during the climb, I'll lose up to 25 pounds," he said. "At high altitudes, there is a tendency to lose your appetite. Yet due to the enormous physical exertion required on an expedition, it takes more than double the normal intake of calories to replace the fuel used during the day."

To help ensure good nutrition, the team takes along supplies of nutrient-rich foods, ranging from freeze-

Give Mom A Treat Let Her Brunch In Bed

This year, let children go into the kitchen for a special gift to pamper Mom. The gift, of course, is edible—a brunch they'll all cook together with Dad's help. Teamwork and careful planning is the key to serving this Mother's Day brunch, but it can be prepared "solo" with advance preparation. Buttermilk pancakes take on a festive look when the batter is poured into gingerbread cookie cutters. Extra batter can be poured from a measuring cup with a thin spout to spell MOM. Decorate the pancake stacks with edible raisin eyes, peanut buttons, coconut hair and a cranberry orange sauce skirt. Make a cranberry milkshake with chopped almonds, rich vanilla ice cream and whole berry cranberry sauce. Mixing cranberry orange sauce with applesauce makes a colorful side dish for the pancakes and takes only a few minutes. To avoid any last-minute

rush in the kitchen, prepare some items in advance. Cranberry nut bread for example. Softened sweet cream butter can be pressed into heart-shaped molds ahead of time, too. Add a few extra touches to Mom's brunch tray: a rose, a box of freshly dipped chocolate apricots.
