Joyce Mokhesi, sister of one of the x, told a United Methodistconsored news conference here Aug. 5 that Justice Minister Kobie oetsee has stayed indefinitely the xecution order to allow for exhaus-

ion of the legal process. Ms. Mokhesi, a student at Oxford niversity in England, is in the nited States to urge the Reagan administration to plead for clemency
