Howard Trustees Concerned About Administrators

WASHINGTON. (AP)-Trustees of Howard University have expressed concern that the institution's administration might be incapable of resolving pressing problems and agreed to closely monitor top administrators, it was reported

Board members also told administrators that they hold them responsible for student demonstrations at the predominantly black university that subsided only after the intervention of Mayor Marion Barry, Jr. and civil rights leader Jesse Jackson, the Washington Post

John E. Jacob, chairman of the board of trustees, told reporters that in a board meeting with President James Cheek and others, "We expressed our expectation that the administration will manage this institution as efficiently and effectively as possible and correct the inadequacies that exist. The board wants to make

that exist. The board wants to make sure we don't get a recurrence [of the demonstrations] in the future."

CHARGED WITH EMBEZZLING

A Johnston County painting con-tractor has been charged with embezzling almost \$12,000 in state taxes by failing to turn over the money to the government after withholding it from employees' paychecks.

Larry Gene Bagwell, 42, of 828 Johnston Union Road, Clayton, was arrested at a work site in northern Johnston County on Thursday on four charges of embezzlement and three counts of aiding and abetting embezzlement, said Dewey N. Sanders, supervisor of the special investigations unit of the state Department of Revenue.

Bagwell was indicted on the counts Monday by a Wake County grand jury, which charged him with embezzling \$11,840.02, Sanders said. He was released Thursday on \$5,000

FBI Denies Lack Of Involvement In Vicious, Murderous Drug War

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation William Sessions admitted his ation has no task force working the district's streets, even though this is the nation's capital and the drug-related murder rate is escalating to the point that some pro-minent citizens are seriously con-sidering requesting that the National



Guard be called in.

Sessions declared, however, the FBI is in the process of formulating a policy in the District of Columbia that fickers from Mexico, South America, policy in the District of Columbia that will put this desperately needed task force in the city streets similar to others his organization has operating in six other U.S. cities that are fighting the deeply entrenched drug traffic. Sessions was responding to an NNPA query at a lengthy news conference at the FBI headquarters on why the FBI seems to have no visible enforcement policy toward the murderous drug wars raging in the nation's capital.

"There is no major drug trafficking

"There is no major drug trafficking organization in the district," he said.
"There is a lot of crack" on the streets. But what about the crack deaths that are running so high now that more young people are being killed in D.C. than in Beirut, Lebanon? Don't these spring from drug traffick-ing? he was asked. "Yes," he acknowledged, "and we are not igacknowledged, "and we are not ignoring this. We are not far away from formulating a plan for the city." He insisted that there is now "a strong climate of cooperation between" the FBI and district police. Some observers believe that if those murdered were white, the FBI would be doing more than making pious pronouncements about "cooperation" with district police.
