Judge Ramsey Named Dean Of Law School

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Superior Court Judge Henry Ramsey, Jr., of Alameda County, Calif., has been named dean of the Howard University School of Law, Howard President Franklin G. Jenifer announced last week.

The 56-year-old judge's appointment is effective Nov. 26.

Dr. Jenifer, who became president of Howard in April, says, "With the highly respected judge's extensive legal experience and his reputation for hard work, he will head a school rich in tradition that we expect to be top-rated."

Founded in 1869, the Howard School of Law today has a 25-member full-time faculty and approximately 350 students. One of its noted alumni is U.S. Supreme Court Associate Justice Thurgood Marshall.

Ramsey has been a judge on the Superior Court of the State of Califor-


nia's Alameda County since 1980, holding various positions on the court. From 1971-80, he was a professor at the School of Law (Boalt Hall), University of California at Berkeley.
