development in this area and milder climate contribute to its accessibility by ground and air carriers. Raleigh-Durham International Airport is an American Airlines "hub" and offers service by many other major airlines as well.  
The nearby Research Triangle Park is an outstanding example of the benefits of working relationships among government agencies, universities and businesses. In this pastoral setting are major facilities of the IBM Corp., the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the chemical giants Burroughs-Wellcome and Glaxo, and many other private industries. The park is also the headquarters of Sigma Xi, the national scientific fraternity, as well as the Chemical Industry Institute of Toxicology and

last year—more than in any single year of the previous decade—according to the FBI Uniform Crime Report. Firearms were the weapon of choice in nearly 60 percent of the murders. And handguns alone accounted for nearly 50 percent of the total.  
It becomes harder and harder to rationalize the growing violence around us when we realize that the areas with the fastest-rising levels of violence are rural states, according to a recent Senate Judiciary Committee report. Nebraska, Colorado, Kansas, Arkansas, Iowa, and Oklahoma, among others, all had higher increases in the rate of crime than did New York City last year.  
Ten years ago, while serving as press secretary to President Ronald Reagan, I was shot in the head by a man who easily purchased a handgun over the counter. Since that time, there has been mounting pressure on Congress to pass legislation making it more difficult for criminals, drug addicts and the mentally ill to obtain handguns.  
This year, Congress passed a bill requiring a waiting period and background check for the purchasers of handguns—a proposal long advocated by law enforcement officers

nationwide. The measure, known as the Brady Bill, will soon go to President Bush's desk. But the hardcore gun lobby continues to fight the Brady Bill, and is vigorously lobbying President Bush to veto this life-saving measure.  
President Bush needs to hear from us—the other guys; the folks without millions of dollars or armies of lobbyists. I have a fast and easy way for you to send a message to the president. Just call 1-900-226-4455 and leave your name and address. A letter will be sent in your name to the president letting him know you support the Brady Bill. The call will only take two minutes and the \$2.75 cost will appear on your phone bill.  
We can quell the random violence which threatens each and every one of us. We can make our neighborhoods safer. We can send our children to schools free from gun violence. A phone call from you today can start us on our way.

between 1936 and 1964. During that period, both parties fell all over each other passing bills that benefited blacks because—and this is the point—blacks voted 65 percent Democratic and 35 percent Republican.  
Therefore, the future of the race-based "Southern Strategy" to win white votes is actually in the hands of black voters, not white Republicans.  
We can stop the "Southern strategy" in its tracks today if 20 percent of blacks voted Republican or independent. And, simultaneously, we would change the candidates and the policies of the Republican Party—just as we stopped the Democratic Party from being an all-white party by joining.  
It's not about what either party will do for us (which is nothing); it's about what we will do for ourselves by intelligently using the two-party system.  
That's why I joined the Republican Party.

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## THE HOME GAME

**TIME SAVER** — Cut the grilling time for chicken by one-third to one-half by partially cooking in the microwave. Cover chicken with wax paper and microwave on high for 10 minutes, turning and rearranging pieces after five minutes. Allow 15 to 20 minutes on the grill, basting with a favorite sauce.  
**STORAGE TIP** — If you store your blankets in plastic bags, remember to punch small holes in the bags so air can circulate during the summer months.  
**HOT WEATHER THAW** — Do you take meat from the freezer in the morning to thaw for the evening meal? During hot summer months wrap it in several thicknesses of newspaper and by late afternoon it'll be thawed, but still chilled.  
**KEEP IT LIGHT** — Your rice will be fluffier if you place a double-folded paper towel over the top of the pan as soon as the rice is cooked, then replace the lid and let stand in a warm spot for five to 10 minutes before serving.  
**THINK TALL** — Ice tea spoons are great to have in a kitchen drawer for thrusting into tall jars such as those holding mayo, pickles or olives.  
**SQUEEZE PLAY** — Your handwashed sweaters will dry much quicker if you force as much moisture as possible from them. Try pressing them between Turkish towels and squeezing water out with a rolling pin.

I saw no evidence of homelessness, drug addiction or alcoholism on the streets—no mumbling humans walking aimlessly from pillow to post. As I drove back to North Carolina and reviewed my experience in my mind, the thought that came to me was—Home is where they always let you in.
