The Methodist Churches of Virginia and eastern North Carolina are preparing for a great simultaneous United Evangelistic Mission April 19-26. About 800 visiting pastors from surrounding states will assist the 800 ministers of the area in preaching and visitation evangelism crusades in the nearly 1500 Methodist churches.

The Methodist churches of Dare County will cooperate in this unprecedented endeavor, according to an announcement by Rev. H. R. Ashmore, Manteo pastor. Local church committees have been working for many weeks. Prayer groups have been formed. Lists of unchurched persons have been compiled.

The opening highlight of the Mission will be the great Youth 18, to be held at the First Methodist Church, Elizabeth City. to attend.

A second feature will be the training school in evangelism for pastors to be held at City Rd. Methodist Church, Elizabeth City, and Plymouth Methodist Church, beginning April 17. Outstanding pastors from S. C. and Md. will speak on the new techniques of evangelism for our day.
