BUXTON MAN'S MURDERERS GET PRISON TERMS

Slayers of Ross Midgett Tried in New Jersey Last Week

The slayers of Ross E. Midgett, young Buxton man in New Jersey on August 30, were tried last week in Morristown, and four of them drew prison sentences ranging from ten years downward.

Thirteen youths were involved in the slaying in "Lovers Lane" in Denville. One got seven to ten years, four drew suspended sentences in Superior court and were placed on probation. The other eight, all juveniles-were to be dealt with by juvenile au-

George Compo, 22, of Denville, whom police tabbed as the ringleader, drew the lone prison sentence imposed by Judge Donald Waesche in the case.

Compo was sentenced on a plea of no defense to second degree murder on Nov. 9. He could have received up to 30 years in prison. He will serve his jail term in Bordentown Reformatory.

Those receiving suspended sentences were Richard Mitchell, 16, Denville; Jerre Hinkle, 20, Morris Plains; Edward Dresh, 19, Denof Denville.
