Seven vacant and unused buildings of the former Naval Auxilliary Air station at the Manteo Airport were sold to the highest bidders Tuesday by the Dare County Board of Commissioners, by permission of the CAA, and the proceeds will be used for the upkeep of other buildings at the Airport.
