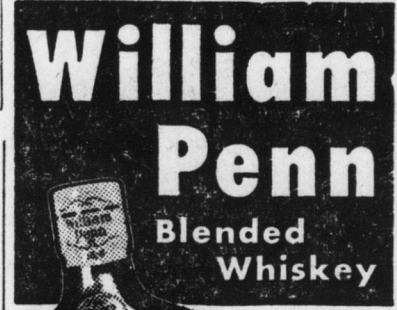

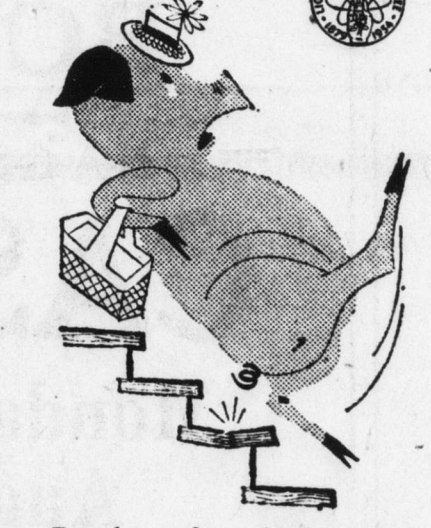

NATIONAL FARM SAFETY WEEK • JULY 25-31

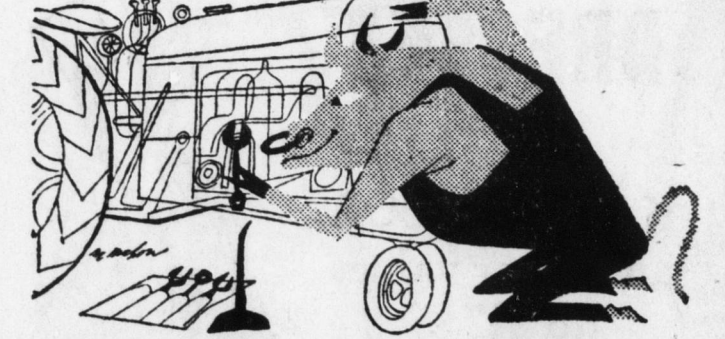


You can bet your life **Safety Pays!**

There's trouble and danger in unfilled holes and ditches, and in unprotected hay chutes, uncovered water tanks, cisterns, wells! Check your farm for hazardous openings into which people or animals might fall; remember, especially, children are curious about things they can crawl into.



Repair weak or broken steps; check handrails. Keep stairways clear of boxes, brooms, toys, etc. Be sure all steps are well lighted. Never over-wax steps.



Keep farm machinery in A-1 repair, but don't fix it while it's running! Don't "save time" by leaving off safety shields on power take-offs. Keep children away from machinery. Keep electric motors clean and free of trash accumulation. Keep home appliances and cords in good condition.



Always wear gloves when repairing rusty or barbed fences. Use only an approved electric fence controller. Keep electric cords in good condition; use only moisture-proof cords outside; heavy rubber cords for motors.



Make a safety inventory of farmyard and home. Keep tools picked up. Be sure that the pathway to your main electrical switch box is free of all obstructions. Inspect switches, insulation, outlets. Keep extra, proper-size fuses on hand.
