IT PAYS TO ADVERTISE

RICE-CHEESE-EGG LOAF



1/2 cup flour
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
1/2 teaspoon sage
2 1/2 cups milk
2 cups grated sharp cheddar cheese
1 tablespoon grated onions
3 cups cooked rice
3 eggs, slightly beaten
3 hard-cooked eggs

Combine flour, salt, pepper, mustard, sage, and about 1/2 cup of the milk; stir until smooth. Stir in remaining milk. Cook until

thickened, stirring frequently. Add cheese and stir until cheese is melted. Remove from heat. Fold in onions and rice. Stir in slightly beaten eggs.

Line bottom of greased 8 1/2 x 4 1/2-inch loaf pan with waxed paper. Put about half of the rice-cheese mixture in bottom of pan. Arrange hard-cooked eggs lengthwise in center. Cover with remaining rice and cheese. Set in pan of hot water. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) about 1 hour or until set. Let stand in pan about 5 minutes before unmolding. Yield: Six servings.
