The State Board of Health of North Carolina having received a petition signed by more than twenty-five (25%) per cent of the resident freeholders within a proposed extension to the Dare Beaches Sanitary District located in Dare County, North Carolina, described in the petition, said petition having been duly transmitted to the State Board of Health of North Carolina by the County Board of Commissioners, Dare County, North Carolina, after having been approved by said Board as provided by Chapter 130, Article 6, of the "General Statutes of North Carolina," as amended, upon consideration thereof it is ordered by the State Health Officer and Secretary of the State Board of Health of North Carolina that a public hearing concerning the proposed extension of the Dare Beaches Sanitary District be held by the State Board of Health of North Carolina through its representative designated for said purpose on Monday, the 6th day of February, 1956, at 11:00 o'clock a.m. at the residence of Mr. H. V. Hines on Bay Street in Avalon Beach, Dare County, North Carolina, said place being located within the boundaries of the proposed extension to the Dare Beaches Sanitary District, and that notice of the time and place of such hearing be given by publishing a copy of this order in the "Coastland Times", a newspaper published in the Town of Manteo, Dare County, North Carolina, and having a general circulation within the boundaries of said proposed extension for five (5) issues beginning January 6, 1956, which is at least twenty (20) days prior to the time for the holding of said hearing as above set forth, and all citizens, taxpayers or other interested persons desiring to be heard concerning the extension of the Dare Beaches Sanitary District are notified to be present at said time and place. The area to be included in the proposed extension shall be that part of Dare County, North Carolina, the boundaries of which are as follows:

ALL that certain tract or parcel of land, together with the buildings thereon, lying and being in the Village of Avon in Kennekeet Township, Dare County, North Carolina, adjoining the lands of N. E. Price, the George Meekins Estate Tract and others, and bounded as follows: Beginning at a concrete monument situated on the East margin or right of way of the Village Road in and near the Village of Avon, said monument and beginning point being in and marking the Northwest corner of the N.
