Mr. Gibbs takes over the superintendency of Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreation Area on North Carolina's "outer banks" and of Fort Raleigh National Historic Site on nearby Roanoke Island at a strategic time when the Service's 10-year MISSION 66 program is getting underway there. Though some construction has been accomplished-including a modern dayuse beach facility on Bodie Island, part of the Cape Hatteras area, and certain roads and parking areas-the planned development program is in a pioneering stage. Up to now, Superintendent Hanks has been largely concerned with necessary planning and research preparatory to the projected development of the unique seashore area to meet the contemplated visita-

tion influx by 1966. A native of Madison. Virginia, Gibbs is a graduate of Virginia Polytechnic Institute. He joined the National Park Service in 1934 in a supervisory capacity in Shenandoah National Park, Virginia, in connection with Civilian Conservation Corps work. Later he served at Shenandoah as a park ranger. After Army service, 1940-45—he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for meritorius service by the United States Army and the Croix de Guerre by the French Army—he became chief park ranger at Shenandoah; then, assistant superintendent at Big Bend Na-tional Park, Texas, and superintendent of Isle Royal National Park, Michigan. He has been assistant superintendent of Great Smoky Mountains National Park since August 1956.
