Rev. W. E. Cholerton, minister of the church, heard the wedding vows which were exchanged in a setting of ferns, white gladioli and pompon chrysanthemums, arranged around seven-branched candelabra with lighted candles. Mrs. Victor Meekins, organist, and Wiley Warren Johnston, Jr., of Oak Ridge, Tennessee, brother of the bride, furnished the wedding music. Mr. Johnston sang "O Promise Me", "I Love You", "Because", and "Lord's Prayer."

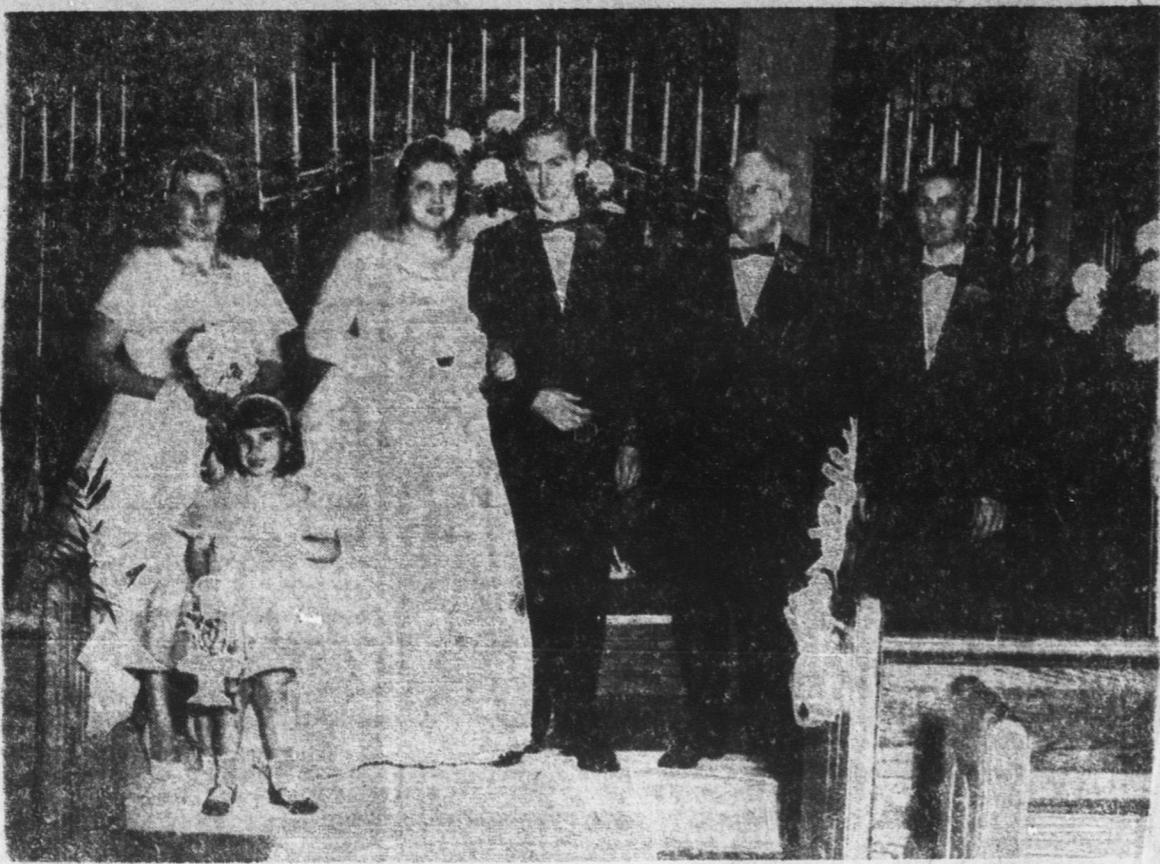
The bridegroom's mother wore a black tulle dress fashioned with bands of hemstitching, white accessories and a corsage of red roses.
