Two Stores Show Net Profit of \$36,671.57; Nags Head Sales Over 60% of Total

The audit of the affairs of the Dare County ABC systems for the year ending June 30, 1959, reveals that a net profit was made for the two stores of Nags Head and Manteo in the total sum of \$36,671.57. Of this, the Manteo store's profit was \$14,147.89. Of the profit of this store 15 per cent was paid by the sum of \$2,122.18 for the past fiscal year.

Sales of the Manteo store represented only 38.58% of total sales.

Hyde County's Roper Lands Given Publicity As New Own-ers Market Them

From time to time this newspaper has given publicity to several attempts that have been undertaken in Hyde County for the development of swamp and other cut over lands namely in the vicinity of Ponzer and Engelhard.
