1,183 KILLED IN 1959 ON HIGHWAYS OF STATE RALEIGH. — The year 1959 spelled tragedy for at least 1183 persons and sadness for many thousands of others, the Motor Vehicles Department said this week. The tentative death toll of 1183 highway fatalities was described as the "second worst in North Carolina motor history." Officials closed their books on the grim total at midnight, De-

ember 31. Persons injured and who later die plus delayed death reports will boost the final reckoning somewhat, department analysts said. Not since 1941 when 1289 died has the Tar Heel motor toll been greater. Reviewing the past decade fatalities year by year totaled: 989 in 1950, 1071, '51, 1115 in '52, 1118 in '53, 991 in '54, 1165 in '55, 1108 in '56, 1063 in '57, 1081 in '58 and a tentative 1183 last year.
