Finest Lifeboat Station On Our Coast to Be Built This Year; Plans Near Complete

Construction work on a new

The new station will replace the one formerly located on the northern tip of Ocracoke Island which was washed away some VISITS IN THE COASTLAND vears ago.

> The new Hatteras Inlet Lifeboat Station will be located at the site of the Gobseville Gun Club, where the Coast Guard has maintained a temporary station since 1954, in the building formerly housing the shooting club.

> Though the building design is still on the drawing boards, plans however, point toward a two-story masonry structure with detached lookout tower and combined garage-equipment building. The buildings will be faced in brick veneer. It will be the first brick lifeboat station erected in either Dare or Hyde Counties.
