The targest of a series of Forest COLUMBIA MAN ADVANCES fires raged all week near Ponzer in Hyde County, burning over about 9,000 acres of land, some of it marshland, to the east of the community. The fire was still raging Wednesday. A water-bomber plane from the Georgia Forestry Commission was summoned to arrive Wednesday to aid in the fight, and proved very effective, foresters re-

Fire fighters were to be called in from the Camp LeJeune Marine Base; others were called from Raeligh, Elizabeth City, New Bern, and the nearby State Prison Camps. The State Forestry Division reported that the fire sprung from a land-clearing operation, probably from a burning stump Sunday

\$100,000 SPENT FOR PUBLIC HARBORS THAT ARE A FARCE

County Has Spent The Money Without Providing the People A Single Guarantee

By VICTOR MEEKINS More than \$100,000 has been spent of people's money in Dare County during the past 35 years to provide several communities with public harbors for small boats. Yet during all this time, in no instance was any safeguard set up to insure the rights of the public in future years.

This has been a costly lesson, and there is now no excuse for permitting anything so stupid to happen again. I will name a num-

ber of these cases. Citizens of Manns Harbor are now handicapped because their needs have grown beyond all present facilities in what is known as a "county ditch." When it was built, the officials failed to get properly executed convenances of the land, and now all land bordering the ditch is privately owned. The situation is critical and costly. Men are handicapped in making a livelihood from commercial fishing. Needless strife between neighbors arises, out of the situation.

In Wanchese, a piece of land was bought for a public canal, and several thousands of dollars has been spent on it. But the land has all been dug away, and the borders of the canal may be used by the public only by consent of the priv-RAIFE G. TARKINGTON has been
