Prize Barbecued Ribs

Buy about 1 pound ribs for each serving. Have meat at room temperature. Lay ribs on grill well above hot coals. Cook very slowly, turn frequently. Long, slow cooking is required so allow 11/2 to 2 hours. To test for doneness, bones should move easily and there should be no sign of pink meat next to bone.

To smoke-barbecued ribs, wait until last 30 minutes of cooking to brush on barbecue sauce, or brush on the sauce just before ribs are served. This way, the ribs get full benefit of the hickory-smoke flavor.

Speedy Grilled Ribs

Cook ribs in pressure cooker then grill over hot coals for an outdoor finish. If desired, brush with your favorite sauce while grilling. Or, add a few drops of liquid smoke to the sauce for a smoky taste.
