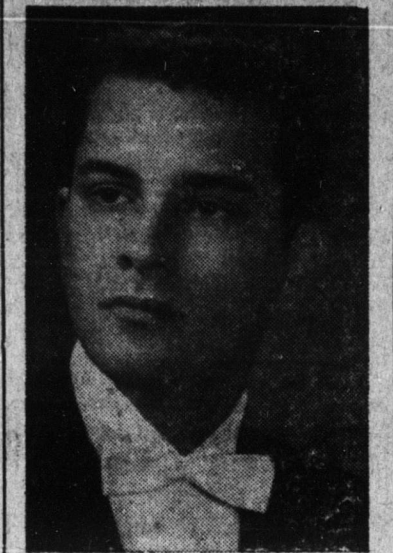

Visitors to Raleigh, North Carolina, on December 16 and 17 are invited to see the Governor's Mansion in Christmas decor. The Raleigh Garden Club is decorating the Mansion, as it does for one Christmas season during the four-year term of each Governor. The entire first floor of the stately Victorian residence of North Carolina's first family will be opened to the public from 3 until 10 p.m. December 1 and from 1 until 6 p.m. on December 17. Governor Terry Sanford, inaugurated on January 5 of this year, is the 20th Governor of North Carolina to occupy the Mansion since it was completed in 1889.
