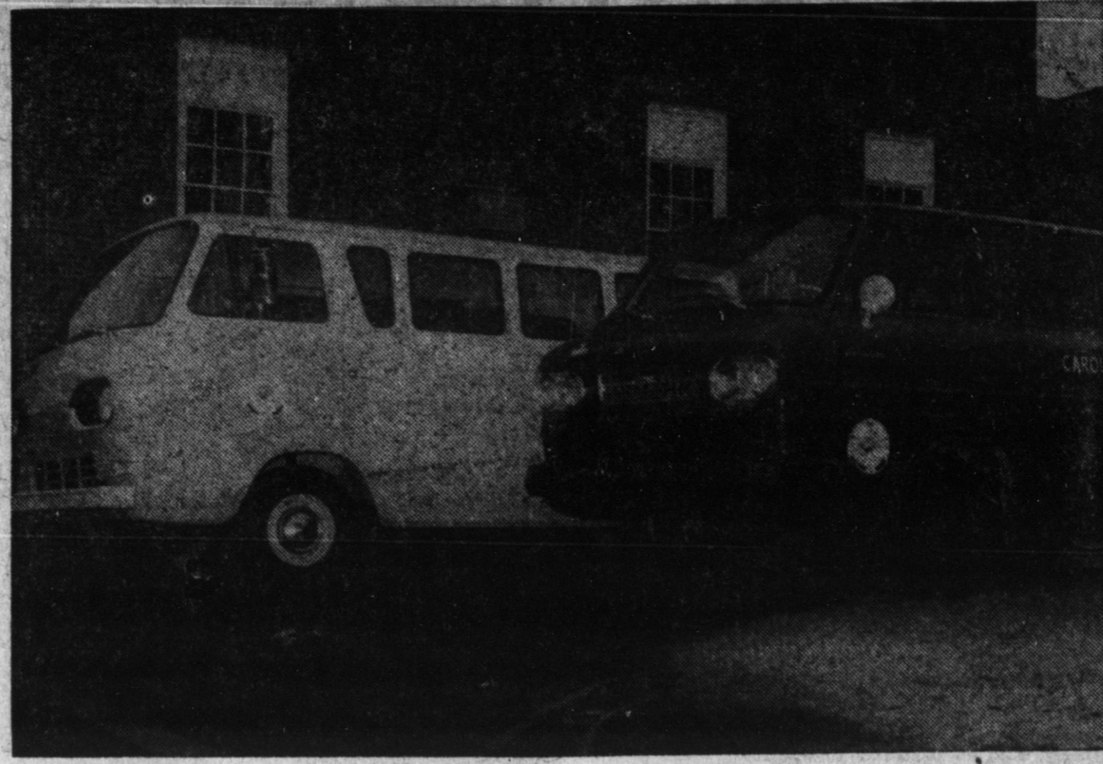


NEW COLORS FOR PHONE TRUCKS
