N. AVERY TILLETT KILLED IN MISHAP THURS. MORNING

Former Coast Guardsman and K.D.H. Police Succumbs to Injuries When Pinned **Between Vehicles**

An accident shortly before noon Thursday took the life of Nelson Avery Tillett, Kill Devil Hills Assistant Police Chief and Dare Co. A. B. C. officer. A collision between Mr. Tillett's police car and the city dump truck caused the tragedy.

Exact details of the accident are uncertain, but C. A. York. town commissioner stated that the accident happened about 11:30 a.m. Apparently Mr. Tillett had been driving along the highway and pulled off the road behind the city truck, which was parked on the highway. Mr. Tilleet's car was halfway
