RICH SQUARE ANGLERS CATCH RODANTHE FISH

A two-pound puppy drum was caught from the Hatteras Island Ocean Pier in Rodanthe Tuesday morning. It was the first baby channel bass of the season taken from the pier, which Rudy Gray of Waves is again operating.

"Mrs. A. D. Phillips of Rich Square caught the puppy drum, and her fishing companions, Mrs. Garland Lane, Mrs. E. D. Bishop and a Mrs. Gillett, also caught some small black drum, some fair size croakers, spot, bluefish and speckled trout," said Woodrow Edwards, who will operate the restaurant near the pier this fall.

Edwards reported that, excepting a 43-pound channel bass landed for the surf at the wreck of the schooner Kohler between Salvo and Avon by Raymond Bassett of Buxton last week, the next largest channel bass from the surf was a 25-pounder reeled in by Farrow Payne, a few days ago.

Surf waters of the Rodanthe-Waves and Salvo area usually are prime fishing sectors during the autumn months and during the fall of 1962 many channel bass were taken, not only from the surf, but also piers.

substantial increase in the volume of business the size of the agency's staff remains the same.

"Farmers Home Administration programs have an impact on urban as well as rural families. A borrower's survey shows their farm and home operating expenses and capital expenditures, average between \$10,000 and \$12,000 annually. These dollars for the most part are used to buy goods and services processed or produced in the towns and cities. The average assets of borrowers surveyed was \$29,000. These assets, built with supervised credit, strengthen the tax base that supports community facilities and reduces the tax burden on nonfarmers," the County Supervisor said.

Of the \$530,185 loaned and insured by the Farmers Home Administration in fiscal 1963 in Hyde and Dare Counties, approximately one-fourth went to farmers to pay for equipment, feed, seed, livestock, fertilizer, for other farm and home operating needs and to refinance chattel debts.

Farmer ownership loans totaling \$88,900 were used by 5 farmers to enlarge, develop, and buy farms not larger than family size, and to refinance debts.

Soil Conservation loans totaled \$25,700. Rural housing loans totaling \$170,535 were made to 17 farmers and rural residents. The bulk of this total was for construction and repair of houses and essential farm buildings.

Emergency loans amounting to \$133,720 were made to 32 farmers to assist in maintaining normal farming operations following disasters such as droughts, floods, and storms.

All Farmers Home Administration loans are accompanied by technical advice on farm and financial management. Loans are made only to applicants who are unable to obtain needed credit from conventional lenders.

great increase in the number of campers on Hatteras Island next year as the new Oregon Inlet bridge will be complete and opened to traffic. It has been a slow problem at times in recent years for campers using trailers to cross Oregon Inlet aboard the ferries. The bridge will eliminate the waiting time for trailers as the bridge can be made at any time of day or night and in only a few minutes.

The 66 percent increase in number of campsites will give the National Seashore a total of 741 sites, which if occupied at anytime to the extent the present facilities have been used on holiday weekends this year would give Dare County a camping population equal, approximately, the same as the normal census population of the county which is only slightly more than 6,000 year around residents.

"Of course our county's year-around or winter population is small in comparison to the estimated 25 to 30 thousand daily population in July and August," said a Tourist Bureau spokesman.

Beach Erosion Board and to the Board of Engineers for Rivers and Harbors in Washington, D. C. Interested parties may present written views on the report to these Boards. Statements submitted should not repeat material previously presented as this information is already available to the Boards. Information submitted should be new, specific in nature, and bear directly on the findings in the report. Hearings will be held only on written request explaining the need to present material not included in the report.

Written communications will be handled by the Board of Engineers for Rivers and Harbors, Washington 25, D. C. by 14 October 1963. If extension of this date is considered necessary, requests giving reasons and additional time desired should be submitted as soon as possible. The Boards consider communications and the report at a date subsequent to expiration of notice. Information furnished by mail receives the same attention as that received at public hearing. Should the Boards not be convinced of the soundness of recommendations in the report, notice to that effect will be mailed to all known interested parties prior to final action.

Further information may be obtained from this office or the District Engineer, U. S. Army Engineer District, Wilmington, P. O. Box 1890, Wilmington, N. C. Interested parties, including the press, may make such notes of the contents of the report as they desire.
