A reading workshop for the benefit of elementary school teachers of Dare county will be offered Aug. 19-23 by the board of education through the sponsorship of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA).

Mrs. Smith explained that Duck and Colington were not included in the district, but separate petitions would be drawn up for each of these
