Information Given Out By Swan Quarter Office to Clear Confusion

Newspapers cannot be sent to soldiers overseas by second class mail, except under certain conditions. They can be sent to members released last week by the Swan Quarter post office to help clear away the confusion that exists

It was stated that many people attempted to send the home newspaper to their relatives and friends in the army. The only way this can be done is by first class mail, like any letter. This goes at 3c an ounce or fraction thereof. It cannot weigh more than 8 ounces. Airmail rates are 6c for 1-2 ounce or frac-
