DEMAND FOR STAMPS.

Stock Running Low and the Bu-
reau Working Overtime

WASHINGTON, March 15.—An evi-
dence of the commercial activity in the
country is shown in the enormous de-
mand is so heavy and persistent that
the reserve stock of stamps has de-
come greatly depleted. The law re-
quires that there shall be kept con-
stantly on hand at the Bureau of En-
graving and Printing 100,000,000 one-
cent and 200,000,000 two cent stamps.
Heretofore there never has been any
difficulty in supplying current demands,
and, at the same time, maintaining this
reserve. The demand recently, how-
ever, has increased so rapidly that the
number of two-cent stamps in the re-
serve has been decreased to 150,000,000,
and the number of one-cent stamps to
30,000,000, and now the Treasury De-
partment has decided to increase the
hours of work in the postage stamp
division of the Bureau of Engraving and
Printing to prevent further encroach-
ment upon the reserves.

A FROST TONIGHT.
Fair Weather Sunday With Rising
Temperature.

The forecast of the weather bureau
for Raleigh and vicinity says: Fair,
with frost tonight; Sunday fair, slowly
rising temperature.

The barometer is lowest off the New
England coast and cloudy weather still
prevails in the northeast section. The
area of high barometer is central over
the lower Mississippi valley. Clear,
cold weather prevails throughout the
central valley and over all the Southern
States. Heavy to killing frosts were
reported this morning from Pal-
cine, Texas, east to Jacksonville, Fla.,
and north to Wilmington. The high
area will drift eastward today, giving
heavy frost in North Carolina tonight.
